Explanation (if required):

Prior Board Action(s): On June 26, 2007, your Board approved the transfer of the administration of the Sonoma Green Business Program to the Economic Development Department, and the expansion of the Sonoma Green Business Program to include all industry types available through the Bay Area Green Business Program. On April 14, 2009 your Board recognized certification for 13 businesses. To date, your board recognized 67 business sites as being certified through the SGBP.

Alternatives - Results of Non-Approval: Organizations will not be recognized as Green Businesses as designated by the Sonoma Green Business Program and the Bay Area Green Business Program.

Background:

The Sonoma Green Business Program (SGBP) gives recognition for the environmental performance of businesses and government agencies that volunteer to implement high standards of pollution prevention and resource conservation. To be certified “green,” participants must be in compliance with all regulations and meet program standards for conserving energy and water, preventing pollution, and minimizing waste. The SGBP, in association with the Bay Area Green Business Program (BAGBP) run by the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) allows for fourteen industry types to be certified “green”; they are auto body repair, auto services, dentists, hotel, landscaper, office/retail, painter, printer, remodeler, restaurant, schools, wet/CO₂ cleaners, winery industries and small manufacturers. The BAGBP also allows for partner agency recognition as certified “green.”

The following businesses and government agency have met BAGBP standard for “green” certification: Circle Bank Petaluma Branch, Circle Bank Santa Rosa Branch, Environmental Science Associates, Preferred Sonoma Caterers, Rising Design & Construction, Sonoma Corp Yard, Spaulding, McCullough & Tansil LLP, and Wright Engineered Plastics. Thus far, the program has received close to 200 applications, with 97 businesses currently engaged in the certification process, including Sonoma County’s Fleet Operations, wineries, printers, and office/ retail establishments throughout the County.

Businesses that are certified “green” receive recognition and public promotion. These businesses are issued window decals with the Green Business Logo, allowing the business to advertise its practices to environmentally conscious consumers. Businesses are also authorized to use the Green Business logo for their advertising, receive a certification of distinction at County-level public meetings, and are listed on both the SGBP and BAGBP websites and the BAGBP directory.
