



TOLAY LAKE REGIONAL PARK

INTERIM PLAN UPDATE

APRIL 11, 2008



Sonoma County Regional Parks staff presented a proposed Day-Use Permit Program for implementation during the Interim Public Access & Management Plan (Interim Plan) phase for Tolay Lake Regional Park at two meetings late last month. Staff would like to extend a sincere thanks to those individuals who participated in the special Working Group – we couldn't have done this without you!

The Tolay Lake Regional Park Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and Neighbors met with staff on Thursday, March 27th. A Public Workshop was held before the Sonoma County Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) on Monday, March 31st. The Day-Use Permit Program proposal met with positive responses at both meetings.

The Day-Use Permit Program orientations have not yet been scheduled. Staff has a lot of work to complete before the Interim Plan can be presented to the Board of Supervisors for adoption and approval. Currently, we are revising the Interim Plan Traffic Study and developing the Orientation Program and Annual Trail Monitoring Program. Then, the Interim Plan Initial Study will be revised and provided to the public for a 30-day review and comment period. Parks will mail out postcards to those on the project mailing list when the document is available for review and will post this information on our website.
