

2008 Rubberized Asphalt Pavement Overlay Program – Airport Blvd.



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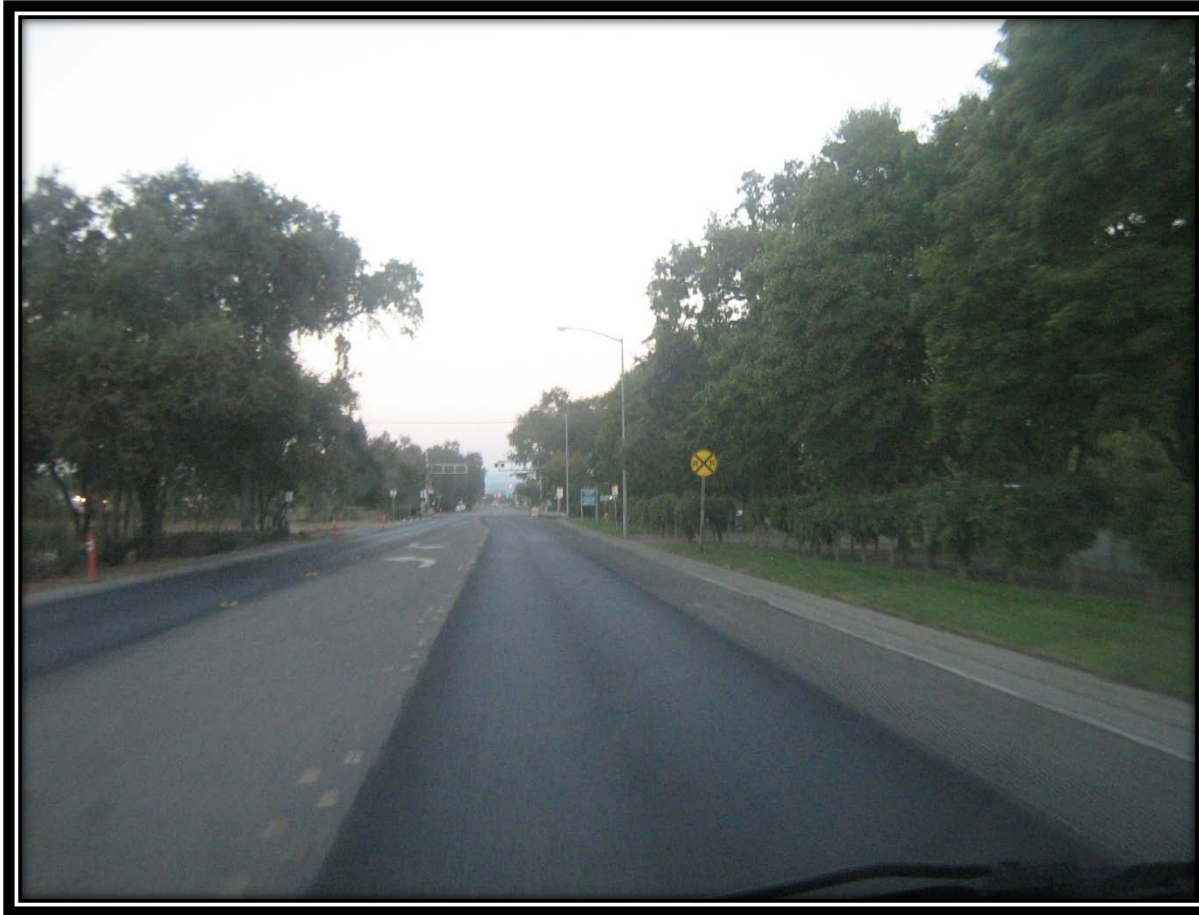


A portion of Airport Blvd.

The 2008 Overlay project involves several roads in Sonoma County, including a portion of Airport Boulevard. An overlay involves placing asphaltic concrete over the road after the surface has been prepared. The thickness of the material is generally determined by the condition of the roadway and the volume and type of traffic using the road.



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An overlay can extend the life of a road for up to 20 years. The rubberized asphalt that was used this year is a higher quality material that is intended to provide a more durable and quieter wearing surface.
